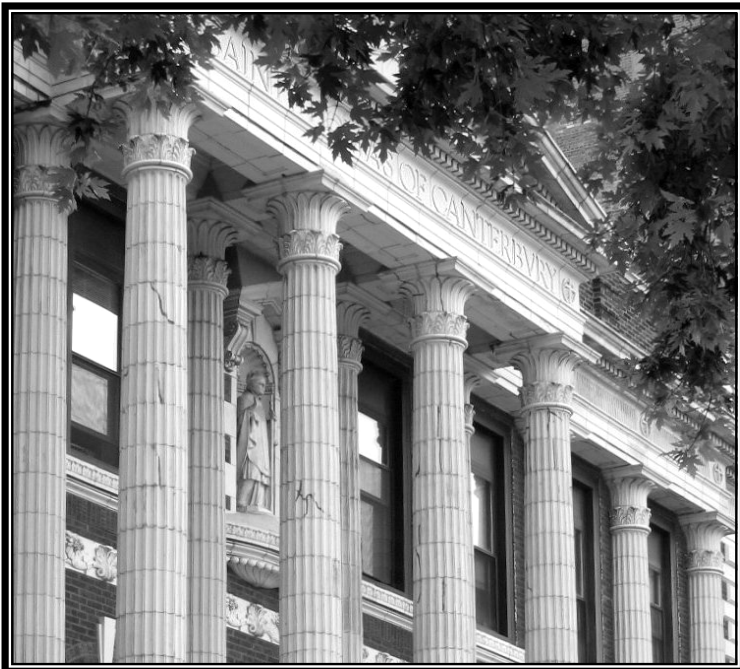

De los Frailes

La Cocina de Sopa de Santo Tomás de Canterbury primero comenzó sirviendo comidas en 1978. Fundada por miembros de la Casa del Trabajador Católico cercano, la Cocina de Sopa se convirtió más en una extensión parroquial a principios de los años 1980's. Desde esos días, Jim Eder ha servido como el "director temporal"—una posición que ha mantenido durante casi 40 años... temporalmente. Jim pasó dos veranos con la fundadora de la Casa del Trabajador Católico Dorothy Day (quién está siendo considerada para la canonización), así que su misión continúa en Uptown.

La cocina de sopa sirve entre 90-120 invitados cada sábado y viernes y está enteramente atendida por voluntarios—por grupos (tales como estudiantes de Loyola o feligreses de iglesias de los suburbios) así como individuos. La Madre Teresa solía decir que sus cocinas de sopa existieron tanto como para los invitados como lo hicieron para los voluntarios.

En este encuentro con los pobres, los voluntarios experimentan una gracia que es sacramental ya que el vínculo entre un comedor social y la Eucaristía es fuerte. Las mesas de la cocina de sopa son una extensión de la mesa del altar. Fritz Eichenberg. Un artista de la madera utilizado ampliamente por las publicaciones de los trabajadores católicos, ilustra perfectamente esta realidad espiritual. Cualquier organización puede alimentar a los necesitados. Pero la difusión Católica es una extensión de la Sagrada Eucaristía – es la Misa que impulsa a los Católicos a alimentar a los hambrientos.

Para hacer esta conexión mucho más clara, STC tiene un Hora Santa de Adoración Eucarística todos los martes a las 7:00pm (después del comedor social) para voluntarios y aquellos que quieren orar por la misión del comedor social.

Como iniciativa nueva, ampliaremos la adoración del martes en STC a todo el día—desde después de la misa de la mañana hasta las 7:00pm Hora Santa – como una forma de apoyar el comedor en oración. Cecilia Pérez, una STC parroquiana, coordinará el horario. Por favor, contacte al P. Bob si usted quiere ayudar con este importante ministerio nuevo. From the Friars

The St. Thomas of Canterbury Soup Kitchen first began serving meals in 1978. Founded by members of the nearby Catholic Worker House, the Soup Kitchen became more of a parish outreach in the early 1980's. Since those days, Jim Eder has served as the "temporary director"—a position he has continued to hold for nearly 40 years... temporarily. Jim spent two summers with Catholic Worker founder Dorothy Day (who is being considered for canonization), so her mission continues in Uptown.

The soup kitchen serves 90-120 guests every Tuesday and Friday night and is staffed entirely by volunteers—by groups (such as students from Loyola or parishioners from suburban churches) as well as individuals. Mother Teresa used to say that her soup kitchens existed as much for the guests as they did for the volunteers.

In these encounters with the poor, volunteers experience a grace that is sacramental as the link between a soup kitchen and the Eucharist is a strong one. The tables of the soup kitchen are an extension of the table of the altar.

Fritz Eichenberg, a woodcut artist used extensively by Catholic Worker publications, perfectly illustrated this spiritual reality. Any organization can feed those in need. But Catholic outreach is an extension of the Holy Eucharist—it is the Mass that impels the Catholic to feed the hungry.

To make this connection even clearer, STC has a Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration every Tuesday at 7:00 PM (after the soup kitchen) for volunteers and those who want to pray for the soup kitchen's mission.

As a new initiative, we will be expanding Tuesday adoration at STC to all day—from after Morning Mass until the 7:00 PM Holy Hour—as a way of supporting the Soup Kitchen in prayer. Cecilia Perez, a STC parishioner, will coordinate the schedule. Please contact Fr. Bob if you are willing to help with this important new ministry. And if you would like to volunteer for the soup kitchen, contact information is below.
